

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

Preamble

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, have solemnly resolved to constitute India into a **SOVEREIGN, SOCIALIST, SECULAR, DEMOCRATIC, REPUBLIC** and to secure to all its citizens:

- *JUSTICE*, social, economic and political;
- *LIBERTY* of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;
- *EQUALITY* of status and of opportunity;
- and to promote among them all
- *FRATERNITY* assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do **HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.**

- To safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavor and achievement.
- To provide opportunities for education by the parent the guardian, to his child or a ward between the age of 6-14 years as the case may be.

EXPECTATIONS FROM THE STUDENTS

Rules of the Road

1. *On arrival at school, students must remain on the school property unless a parent or guardian has directly notified a staff member, giving permission for the student to leave.*
2. *It is a legal requirement that students must be in areas that are clearly visible to staff at all times.*
3. *It is a legal requirement that students arriving late for school must report to reception and check in only with permission of a member of the administrative staff.*
4. *Any potentially dangerous or threatening activity such as having a weapon at school, throwing things, fighting or bullying is totally unacceptable.*

A student in breach of this can expect to face suspension or dismissal from the school.

- 5. Chewing gum can be a litter and health problem, and is not allowed at school.*
- 6. Students are expected to seek explicit permission from the relevant person(s) before posting any text or audio visual material on the social platform about any member of the school community.*
- 7. Only senior students (XI/XII) if wish to use two wheelers are permitted with the consent of parents, on condition of equipping with learning licence and regular usage of helmet.*

Uniform

No other clothing should be substituted for school uniform which is to be worn whilst at school including PTM days and travelling to and from the school. Black leather, lace-up school shoes should be cleaned and polished regularly.

Complete proper sports uniform must be worn during Physical Recreation days and Sports Competition days. Students are required to change into their sports uniform during the break immediately prior to the Physical Recreation class, and change out of their sports uniforms during the break immediately following the Physical Recreation classes/sessions on other than scheduled sports uniform days.

Hair

Hair should be worn off students' face and should always be clean, neat and one natural colour, JDKPS students are expected to wear their hair in conventional styles, avoiding extremes of fashion. Girls are expected to make plaits with blue hair band/rubber band.

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS:

To Do: -

- a) To work to the best of their abilities at all times by all means.*
- b) To come to the school each day properly dressed with the properly set bags as per their time table.*
- c) To arrive in class on time and no student will leave school or a class without permission of teacher*

- f) Students need not to tolerate violence or bullying but must speak to the class teacher in case of such happening*
- g) Students are expected to speak truth to their teachers & mentors, If they feel speaking to anyone for any issue confidently, they can rely on their mentors & counsellor.*

- h) Students will attend all classes and never leave the school without gate pass or written permission and ensure all missed work to be done at their own.*

Not to Do: -

- a) Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employee of the school*
- b) Intentional disturbance in classes (Online/Offline)*
- c) Absence from classes without permission of the teacher/ coordinator/ Principal*
- d) Bringing mobile/smart watches in school*
- e) Cyber crime involvement by any means*
- f) Pulling/intimidation others who are working for good cause*
- g) Eve-teasing/misbehaviour with girl students*
- h) Damaging/disfiguring school property*
- i) Indulging in physical violence in any matter.*
- j) Disobeying lawful orders of the teachers/coordinator/Principal*
- k) Bringing unauthorised people/articles inside the school / outside the school vicinity*
- l) Theft/pilferage of school/students property*
- m) Any behaviour unbecoming of a student*

In any act of misconduct, Principal shall take suitable action as per observations of the disciplinary committee depending on the gravity of the misconduct which may include:-

- 1. Oral/Written warning to the students and parents*
- 2. Suspension for 3 to 10 days on the basis of seriousness of misconduct*
- 3. Recovery of loss to the school property*
- 4. Expulsion/rustication from school*

STUDENTS' ATTENDANCE & LEAVE POLICY

It is expected from every student to be punctual, regular and sincere towards the school and studies. A student who absents from the school without prior/ timely sanction shall pay a fine of Rs. 5 per day during which he/she is absent. The name of the student will be struck off from the school rolls if he/she absents without leave for six consecutive days or is continuously on leave for three calendar months. He/she may be re-admitted at the discretion of the school management after the payment of a fresh re-admission fee of Rs. 5000/- and fine for the period of absence from the school. School appreciates and encourages full attendance annually through badges and appreciation certificates.

Leave of absence can be granted to a student on genuine grounds on a written request received from the parents. Leave applied on medical grounds must be supported with a medical certificate. Minimum 75% attendance is compulsory for a student to be eligible to appear in annual exams as per CBSE guidelines. Regular latecomers will either be fined Rs.10/- a day or if required, sent back home by the duty teacher of the day.

No student is allowed gate pass until or unless there is emergency, that also with the permission of the Principal/Coordinator.

- Students who know in advance they will be late to school must submit a diary note from parent/guardian when they arrive.*
- Parent/guardian of all unexplained absence are notified through SMS for the same.*

Parents are expected to seek support when irregularity becomes problem.

FEE DEPOSIT & OFFICE TRANSACTIONS

Kindly follow the schedule of depositing fee timely as per scheduled in the fee book to avoid any inconvenience. School has the authority to strike off the name of child in case fee is not deposited by the 30th day of the due date. Office transaction time 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Your kind cooperation is solicited for regular fee deposit without reminders.

OUR ASSEMBLY

The school conducts the Assembly for classes IV & V and for classes VI – XII separately on all school working days during which due importance is laid on the Gayatri Mantra Recitation, Prayers, Mass P.T., opportunity to read news, speech, talk on moral and spiritual values and thought of the day by Kul in turn. Every teacher on his/ her kul turn is assigned responsibility of elaborating the thought daily for 3-4 minutes.

The Principal addresses the students and makes them aware through her educative, informative and value – oriented talks emphasizing on the personality development through self competition and strong will power weekly and on Special days. The teachers in turn give their talk to the students related to Adhyatm on Thursdays to help the students grow morally and spiritually strong and to inculcate the values and Sanskars in them naturally. Spiritual Teachers are also invited time to time to inculcate the values and etiquettes in the students on the exclusive assembly days.

HOLISTIC ASSESSMENT REFORMS

Implementation of NEP Recommendations in School:

Curriculum Reforms:

ii) Portfolio/NBM – Notebook Maintenance (Weightage 5% to the aggregate):- Notebook/Portfolio submission and lab manuals maintenance as a part of internal assessment are aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes for the topics taught in the classroom as well as assignments of activity labs. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and note book upkeep as well as lab manuals. Portfolio will be assessed during midterm and annual Exam.

iii) MA – Multiple Assessment (Weightage 5% to the aggregate):- These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities and tool tests are recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

A) For languages: Activities conducted for subject enrichment in languages aim at equipping the learner to develop speaking and listening skills as well as understanding the grammar concept to have more confidence in reading, writing and speaking better.

6. Report cards will be shown after every PTs & internal assessment during the PTM. It is must for the parents to attend the same to know about the academic growth of the child.

REMEDIAL ACTION BY THE SCHOOL

1. Students are motivated & counselled throughout the session during assembly / classes / kul meeting or personally through Class Teachers/Coordinator/Principal
2. Mentors and the class teachers keep a close watch on the assigned group for the consistent development of academics & behavioural issues.

B) CO-SCHOLASTIC ASPECT



इन्द्रियान्विमूढात्मा मिथ्याचारः स उच्यते ॥ (3)

भावार्थ— जो मूढ़बुद्धि पुरुष समस्त इन्द्रियों को हठपूर्वक (ऊपर से) रोककर उन इन्द्रियों के भोगों को मन से चिन्तन करता रहता है, वह मिथ्याचारी अर्थात् पाखण्डी कहा जाता है ।

श्रद्धावैल्लभते ज्ञानं तत्परः संयतेन्द्रियः ।

ज्ञानं लब्ध्वा परां शान्तिमचिरेणाधिगच्छति ॥ (4)

भावार्थ— जितेन्द्रिय (साधन परायण) हुआ श्रद्धावान् पुरुष ज्ञान को प्राप्त करता है । तथा ज्ञान को प्राप्त कर वह बिना विलम्ब के तत्क्षण ही परम शान्ति को प्राप्त हो जाता है ।

यतेन्द्रियमनोबुद्धिर्मुनिर्मोक्षपरायणः ।

विगतेच्छामयक्रोधो यः सदा मुक्त एव सः ॥ (5)

भावार्थ— जिसकी इन्द्रियाँ, मन और बुद्धि जीती हुई है, ऐसा जो मोक्षपरायण मुनि इच्छा, भय और क्रोध से रहित हो गया है, वह सदा मुक्त ही है ।

युक्ताहारविहारस्य युक्तचेष्टस्य कर्मसु ।

युक्तस्वप्नावबोधस्य योगो भवति दुःखहा ॥ (6)

भावार्थ— यथायोग्य आहार-विहार, यथायोग्य चेष्टा और यथायोग्य शयन करने तथा जागने वाले को ही यह दुःखनाशक योग सिद्ध होता है ।

देवी ह्येषा गुणमयी मम माया दुरत्यया ।

मामेव ये प्रपद्यन्ते मायामतां तर्जति ते ॥ (7)

भावार्थ— मेरी यह अलौकिक अर्थात् अदभुत त्रिगुणमयी माया बड़ी दुस्तर है, इसलिए जो पुरुष केवल मुझको ही निरन्तर भजते हैं, वे इस माया को लौंघ जाते हैं ।

अग्निोत्तिरहः शुक्लः षण्मासा उत्तरायणम् ।

तत्र प्रयाता गच्छन्ति ब्रह्म ब्रह्मविदो जनाः ॥ (8)

भावार्थ— जिस मार्ग में ज्योतिर्मय अग्नि, दिन, शुक्लपक्ष और उत्तरायण के छह महीने, इन सबके अभिमानों देवता हैं, उस मार्ग में मर कर गए ब्रह्मवेत्ता योगीजन उन देवताओं द्वारा क्रम से ले जाए जाकर ब्रह्म को प्राप्त होते हैं ।

अपि चेत्सुदुराचारो भजते मामनन्यभाक् ।

साधुरेव स मन्तव्यः सम्पूज्यव्यसितो हि सः ॥ (9)

भावार्थ— यदि कोई अतिशय दुराचारी भी अनन्यभाव से मुझ को निरन्तर भजता है, तो वह भी साधु ही मानने योग्य है क्योंकि वह यथार्थ निश्चय वाला है, अर्थात् उसने भलीभाँति निश्चय कर लिया है कि परमेश्वर भजन के समान अन्य कुछ भी नहीं है ।

यो मामजमनादिं च वेत्ति लोकमहेश्वरम् ।

असंमूढः स मन्त्रेषु सर्वपापैः प्रमुच्यते ॥ (10)

भावार्थ— जो मुझे अजन्मा (जन्मरहित) और अनादि तथा

लोकों का महान् ईश्वर रूप से जानता है, वह मनुष्यों में ज्ञानवान् पुरुष सभी पापों से मुक्त हो जाता है ।

मत्कर्मकृन्त्यन्तमो मदभक्तः संद्वगर्वजितः ।

निर्वैरः सर्वभूतेषु यः स मामेति पाण्डव ॥ (11)

भावार्थ— हे अर्जुन ! जो पुरुष केवल मेरे ही लिए यज्ञ, दान और तप आदि सम्पूर्ण कर्तव्य कर्मों को करने वाला है, मेरे परायण है, तथा मेरा भक्त है, अर्थात् मेरे नाम, गुण, प्रभाव, और रहस्य के श्रवण, कीर्तन, मनन, ध्यान का प्रेमभाव से अभ्यास करने वाला है, आसक्ति रहित है और सम्पूर्ण प्राणियों के प्रति वैरभाव से रहित है, ऐसा वह भक्ति वाला पुरुष मुझ को ही प्राप्त होता है ।

श्रेयो हि ज्ञानमभ्यसाज्ज्ञानादभ्यासं विशिष्यते ।

ध्यानात्कर्मफलत्यागस्त्यागाच्छान्तिरनन्तरम् ॥ (12)

भावार्थ— मर्म न जानकर किए हुए अभ्यास से परोक्ष ज्ञान श्रेष्ठ है और परोक्ष से मुझ परमेश्वर के रूप का ध्यान श्रेष्ठ है । ध्यान से भी सब कर्मों के फल का मेरे लिए त्याग श्रेष्ठ है, क्योंकि त्याग से तत्काल ही परम शान्ति होती है ।

क्षेत्रज्ञं चापि मां विद्धि सर्वक्षेत्रेषु भारत ।

क्षेत्रक्षेत्रज्ञयोर्ज्ञानं यत्तज्ज्ञानं मतं मम ॥ (13)

भावार्थ— हे अर्जुन ! तू सब क्षेत्रों में क्षेत्रज्ञ अर्थात् जीवात्मा मुझ को ही जान और क्षेत्र-क्षेत्रज्ञ का अर्थात् विकार सहित प्रकृति का और पुरुष का जो तत्त्व से जानना है, वही जान है, ऐसा मेरा मत है ।

मां च योऽव्यभिचारेण भक्तियोगेन सेवते ।

स गुणान्समतीत्यैतान् ब्रह्मभूयाय कल्पते ॥ (14)

भावार्थ— जो पुरुष अव्यभिचारी भक्तिरूप योग द्वारा मुझे निरन्तर भजता है, वह इन तीनों गुणों को लौंघ कर ब्रह्म से एकत्व के योग्य होता है ।

निर्मानमोहा जितसङ्गन्दोषा अध्यात्मनित्या

विनिवृत्तकामाः ।

द्वन्द्वैर्विमुक्ताः सुखदुःखसङ्गैर्गच्छन्त्यमूढाः पदमव्ययं तत् ॥ (15)

भावार्थ— जिनका मान और मोह नष्ट हो गया है तथा आसक्तिरूप दोष जिन्होंने जीत लिया है और जिनकी नित्य स्थिति परमात्मा के स्वरूप में है तथा जिनकी कामना भली प्रकार से नष्ट हो गयी है, ऐसे वे सुख-दुःख नामक द्वन्द्वों से विमुक्त हुए ज्ञानीजन उस अविनाशी परम पद को प्राप्त होते हैं ।

यः शास्त्रविधिमुत्सृज्य वर्तते कामकारतः ।

न स सिद्धिमवाप्नोति न सुखं न परां गतिम् ॥ (16)

भावार्थ— जो पुरुष शास्त्रविधि को त्यागकर मनमाना आचरण करता है, वह न तो सिद्ध को, न परम गति को और न सुख को ही प्राप्त होता है ।

मनः प्रसादः सौम्यत्वं मौनमात्मविनिग्रहः ।

भावसंशुद्धिरित्येतत्तपो मानसमुच्यते ॥ (17)

भावार्थ— मन की प्रसन्नता, शान्त भाव, भगवत् चिन्तन करने का स्वभाव, मन का निग्रह और अन्तःकरण के भावों की भली भाँति पवित्रता—ऐसे ये मन-सम्बन्धी तप कहे जाते हैं ।

सर्वधर्मान्परित्यज्य मामेकं शरणं व्रज ।

अहं त्वा सर्वपापेभ्यो मोक्षयिष्यामि मा शुचः ॥ (18)

भावार्थ— संपूर्ण धर्मों को अर्थात् संपूर्ण कर्तव्यकर्मों को मुझमें त्याग कर तू केवल एक मुझ सच्चिदानन्दधन वासुदेव परमात्मा की ही अनन्य शरण को प्राप्त हो । मैं तुझे सम्पूर्ण पापों से मुक्त कर दूंगा । तू शोक मत कर ।
